APPLICATION PROCEDURE



Once nominated by your Home University you will receive your codes to access our online application platform. You will be asked to provide us with the following:

- ✓ Identity Document (ID or Passport)
- ✓ Motivation letter
- ✓ Resume
- ✓ Learning Agreement (learning plan signed by the home and the hosting universities).
- ✓ Language certificate (proving your level in English or French, depending on the chosen program)
- ✓ Transcript of records of previous years of studies
- ✓ Insurance covering repatriation, health/hospitalization and civil liability

(can be provided later before arrival to Toulouse)

- ✓ Birth certificate (or any other civil-status document)
- ✓ ID photo





Campus France Tutorial



INSURANCE

It's mandatary to register to an insurance scheme when studying in France. We will ask you to provide us with a copy of your insurance documents before your arrival to Toulouse.





Students from the EU/EEA or Switzerland should posses a **European Health Insurance Card** (EHIC)

This card proves that your local health Institution is responsible for assuming your healthcare costs in France. It covers on average 70% of your healthcare expenses.

If you wish to obtain a complementary refund for the percentage not covered by the Social Security, you will need to take out a supplemental health insurance: this is not mandatory, but we strongly recommend it so that you obtain 100% reimbursement.

Non-European students + European students who cannot get the EHIC Card

Upon your arrival in France, to undertake or continue your studies, you will need to register on the following website, dedicated to foreign students: https://etudiant-etranger.ameli.fr/#/

access to the basic French Social
Security scheme "Assurance Maladie" for
your healthcare expenses.
The following documents should be
provided: identity document (national
I.D. or Passport), School Certificate,
Bank Account Details to provide your
reimbursements, Civil-status document
(birth certificate).

This insurance will cover about 70% of your healthcare expenses.

We strongly recommend to take a supplemental health insurance so that you obtain 100% reimbursement.

It should include coverage for repatriation, health/hospitalization and civil liability.



Campus France

If you live in one of the 44 countries concerned, you must complete the Campus France online application process before you start your visa application.

After you have created your Campus France account through the online PASTEL system and have filled out the personal information section, you will be automatically assigned to the closest French consulate to your permanent address. Then, you must schedule an in-person appointment at your assigned consulate via its official website.

VISA INFORMATION

All non-European students must obtain a visa before leaving their Country.

Once you will get your PURPAN Admission letter you'll be able to apply for a French visa for studies with the nearest French Consulate or Embassy in your Country of residence.

Here is the **official website** for visa application to France where you may get more information about the procedure.

We advise you to begin the procedure as soon as you can and at least 2 months before the beginning of your studies at PURPAN.

As soon as you have obtained your visa for France, please inform us by sending a scan of your visa page on your passport by e-mail: incoming@purpan.fr

You must register and validate your visa HERE within the first 3 months following your arrival







HOW TO GET TO TOULOUSE





BY PLANE: Catch a plane to the nearest airport - the International Airport of Toulouse-Blagnac.

From the airport, there are different possibilities to reach your accommodation:

- ✓ BUS 31 that will quickly bring you to a connection with tram tram L1 going to the city center.
- ✓ Airport Shuttle "Navette aéroport" (9 €) drives you into town to the railway station* "Gare routière de Matabiau" (this shuttle stops at Compans Caffarelli, then Jeanne d'Arc and then Jean Jaures: there, you can catch the metro lines A and B).

BY TRAIN:

Arrival at the railway station* = "Gare routière" **Matabiau** downtown.

BY BUS:

Arrival at the bus station "Gare routière des Voyageurs" Paul Sémard, just next to the railway station* (Eurolines, Flixbus, Ouibus express buses direct from many European Countries).

*From the railway station, you have several possibilities of transportation:

- Métro, line A "Marengo" stop.
- · Buses n° L8 & 14

2. We will also provide you with a list of available accommodations by the end of the application period. You will find rooms in Arsenal and Chapou - the CROUS student residences (more affordable than the private ones...) and rooms in shared student apartments ("colocations").

3. Beware of scams! Don't send money to book your accommodation to the private bank accounts. If you have any doubt, contact our incoming office and we will give you our opinion about the safety of the place you found.



You may obtain in certain cases a state allowance for lodging – CAF.

The procedure requires a certain number of papers (Birth certificate translated into French & certified by an official translator, marriage certificate, income certificate, rent contract, rent receipt, copy of your French student card, bank account details, certificate concerning your status in France –carte de séjour–etc...).

COST OF LIVING

TOULOUSE WELCOME DESK

This multilingual student service has the partners of the Haute-Garonne prefecture, the Academy of Toulouse the **CIF*** of Haute-Garonne

Garonne prefecture, the Academy of Toulouse, the **CIF*** of Haute-Garonne and the **CROUS**** of Toulouse-Midi-Pyrénées. Its action is threefold.





- Housing: the desk provides you with personalized support for all your accommodations such as the search for a guarantor or cash advance to finance your first month of rent. The CAF*** will also help you estimate the housing assistance you may claim
- **Practical, cultural and sporting:** the Welcome Desk provides general information about sports and cultural activities, transport, access to care, scholarships, extra jobs, training offers, solutions offered to students in situations of disability...
- Health: SIMPPS**** service for students where you can get a medical appointment from 8.30 AM till 5 PM on the weekdays.
- Additional French and English language classes. Every international exchange program at Purpan includes at least 20 hours of French language courses. If you wish to have more hours of French, you have a possibility to enroll in the supplementary classes provided by the University of Toulouse. You will find all the necessary information on their website

*CIF - Congé Individuel de Formation (Individual Training Leave, provision allowing employees to take time off from work to pursue training or education to develop their skills)

**CROUS - Centre régional des œuvres universitaires et scolaires (Regional Center for University and School Works). This organization typically provides support services to students, such as housing, scholarships, dining facilities, and cultural activities.

***CAF - Caisse des Allocations familiales (Family Allowance Fund). This organization in France is responsible for distributing various family benefits and <u>allowances</u>.

**** SIMPPS - service interuniversitaire de médecine préventive et de promotion de la santé (Interuniversity Service for Preventive Medicine and Health Promotion. This service typically offers health care, preventive medicine, and health promotion activities for university students.



WELCOME & ORIENTATION DAY

In France, medical services are always paid in advance by the patient, and a general medical consultation costs usually 25€ (it can be more, particularly for medical specialists).

Don't forget to keep all the documents the doctor gives you and send them to your insurance company to get refunded

All international students at Purpan are granted free access to Psychological Help services



WIFI CELL PHONE

Depending on type of your accommodation you may need to get a contract with an internet provider. It could also be useful to get a French phone number. You may do it online or in one of the offices.

Please note that in order to get a French phone number you will have to open a bank account in a French bank.

BANK ACCOUNT

It's usually free to open a bank account in France, however the exact conditions depend on each bank in particular.

To do so you have to take an appointment in the chosen agency or an online bank and provide the following:

- ✓ Passport
- ✓ Visa
- ✓ Proof of residence (contract of rent, electricity bill...)
- ✓ PURPAN School Certificate
